

The <u>Sociology of Culture Research Cluster</u> invites submissions for our Graduate Student Paper Award. Papers should make a timely contribution to the sociology of culture, which can be empirical, theoretical, or methodological. Evaluators will consider research mechanics, argumentative strength, and originality of submissions. One recipient will be selected from among all papers submitted in English, and one recipient will be selected from among all papers submitted in French.

Eligibility Criteria:

Primary Author of Nominated Paper

- Canadian Sociology Association membership in good standing
- MA Student OR PhD Student OR PhD Candidate

Authorship of Nominated Paper

• Sole authored OR Co-authored with another student (MA or PhD)

Conference Presentation of Nominated Paper

- Presentation in a Canadian Sociological Association Conference hosted session (either virtual or in-person)
- Paper presented in a session affiliated with the Sociology of Culture research cluster or another research cluster

Nominated Paper Status

• Unpublished and not yet approved for publication

Nominated Paper Format

- Between 5,000 and 7,500 words (excluding works cited)
- ASA, APA, Chicago, MLA or other citation format should be used consistently throughout
- Submissions will be accepted in either English or French
