# **Eligibility Criteria:**

#### **Primary Author of Nominated Paper**

- Canadian Sociological Association membership in good standing
- Undergraduate or graduate (MA or PhD) student

## **Authorship of Nominated Paper**

- Sole authored paper OR first author of co-authored paper
- An author may only submit one paper for consideration

# **Conference Presentation of Nominated Paper**

## **Nominated Paper Status**

• Unpublished and not yet approved for publication

## **Nominated Paper Format**

Paper length may not exceed 10,000 words (40 pages) maximum, including bibliography and appendices

#### **Submission Instructions:**

- 1. Primary author name, email address, affiliation (academic institution), and study program level (undergraduate, MA, PhD). Co-author name(s), affiliation(s), and, if a student, study program level(s).
- 2. Primary author evidence of student status (i.e. copy of student card)
- 3. Canadian Sociological Association Conference session in which the paper is submitted for presentation
